Silent Sermons

You may never preach a sermon in a pulpit, but don't think for a moment that you aren't preaching. You can and should be preaching "silent sermons" and in fact, arguably these "silent sermons" may actually speak louder than that other kind.

When we arise Sunday morning cheerfully and prepare for the day different than we normally do, we are preaching to the others of our family and to neighbors just how special we view the Lord's Day and the activities of it. I recall a person once sharing the story with me of how her neighbor was so impressed by her faithfulness in attending church services, witnessing her leaving each time as she looked out of the window of her house. It can happen.

By faithfully attending and preparing for the Bible classes we preach a silent sermon to all others in the assembly. Don't think it goes by unnoticed. Others are encouraged and prompted to do better themselves when they observe your faithfulness.

When we cheerfully greet others in the assembly, we not only obey the Lord's command, but we preach a silent sermon. Likewise, visitors' first impressions are lasting impressions and our taking time to welcome them may be the most important thing they take away from the visit...that we care about them.

When we participate enthusiastically in the singing we preach a silent sermon. I have sat in church services where the singing sounded so dead that it told me something about those folks spiritually. The opposite is therefore true...when we zealously enter into the song service, we are telling others of our joy in the Spirit. So do not underestimate your preaching abilities, though they may be silent sermons. You are preaching more than you probably know.
