## Biographies of Dick & Janell Lewis

Dick attended University School twelve years. Janell graduated from Southern High School in 1956. The secretarial subjects taken there provided skills for many years including approximately six years each in lawyers' offices, utility companies, hospital services, learning institutions, and taught piano lessons for sixteen years.

Locust Street C/C in Johnson City, TN became our next church from 1980-1985. Classes at Emmanuel School of Religion were taken.

Our three daughters, Beth (born '62); Nancy ('64) and Susan ('68) have been a blessing to our family along our journey in life. Five grandchildren and two sons-in-laws, Ty Osman and Dale Schreiner, are partners with us in this journey.

Along with part-time preaching (after 25 full-time years) Dick was blessed working twenty years with the retirement community of Appalachian Christian Village in Johnson City, TN, (1986-2006) as administrative assistant, CEO and consultant.
