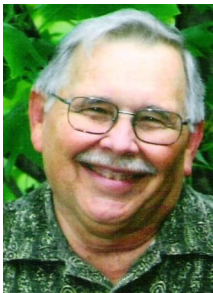

During that time he preached for three small rural Christian Churches for twenty-six years while he served 23 years as a teacher and 14 years as an elementary principal. Their children have blessed them with six grandchildren.

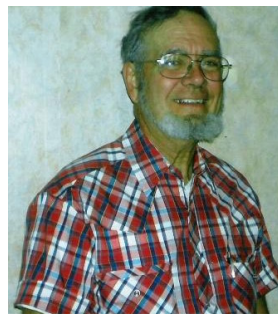
In 1994 David and Dianne earned their MS Degrees at Missouri State University.
